Summer school funding

What is the Summer schools programme?

The Summer schools programme was set up in response to the impact that the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic had on pupils learning. The aim of the Summer schools programme was to provide pupils with academic education and enrichment activities in order to mitigate the impact of lost learning.

At Forest Bridge School, we aimed to ensure that our summer school programme was used by the pupils who would benefit most from across our school. While all pupils entering year 7 were offered a placement, we then prioritised pupils who received free school meals or who experienced particularly challenging times during the pandemic (for example a family loss). For our pupils we focussed significantly on social skills, communication activities and a focus on community inclusion skills.
